Tahoe Regional Arts Foundation in collaboration with Berkeley Center for Law, Energy and the Environment (CLEE), and the Tahoe Prosperity Center will hold an invitation-only convening on options to reduce vehicle miles traveled on Interstate 80 and State Hwy 89/267 in the Lake Tahoe

area during periods of peak visitation. The convening will involve a daylong discussion with transportation experts, and other select stakeholders to discuss strategies and potential opportunities for reducing driving miles during peak times of year.

The focus of the Tahoe Mobility Forum will seek to discover how new and emerging technologies will assist to mitigate the traffic that comes from the Bay Area/East Bay, including visitors from cities (Vallejo-Colfax) along the I80 corridor and on to Hwy 89/267. The Forum will limit its discovery and proposed remedies for those travelers who are visiting the two large ski resorts on the North Shore; Northstar, future developments near Northstar (Martis West), and Squaw Valley.

This will be a virtual event on September 9, 2020. Post event I'll share the results of our Forum discussions.
